## Descriptions (Partial Listing)

Online article databases are for HCC students, faculty, and staff. A **valid HCC ID Number** and PIN (last 4 digits Social Security #) are required for access.

**[Academic Search Premier](#)** Articles, many full-text, from magazines, newspapers, academic journals and reference sources. Covers a wide range of academic areas including business, social sciences, humanities, general academic, general science and education.

**[America's Newspapers](#)** Complete electronic editions of more than 600 U.S. newspapers, including The New York Times, Wall Street Journal and Washington Post. Many local Florida newspapers, and their Spanish-language versions, are also included.

**[Applied Science & Technology Full Text](#)** Periodical coverage includes 575 trade and industrial publications, journals issued by professional and technical societies, and specialized subject periodicals, as well as special issues such as buyers' guides, directories, and conference proceedings.

**[Art Full Text](#)** Full text plus abstracts and indexing of an international array of peer-selected publications—now with expanded coverage of Latin American, Canadian, Asian and other non-Western art, new artists, contemporary art, exhibition reviews, and feminist criticism.

**[Biography Index](#)** Biographical articles appearing from more than 3,000 periodicals, plus some 2,000 current books of individual and collective biography published each year, and biographical material in otherwise non-biographical books. Besides biographies and autobiographies, it includes citations to interviews, obituaries, collections of letters, diaries, memoirs, juvenile literature, book reviews, bibliographies and exhibition reviews. People covered range from antiquity to the present and represent all fields and nationalities.

**[Biography Resource Center](#)** Full-text biographies of figures in literature, science, multicultural studies, business, entertainment, politics, sports, government, history, current events and arts.

**[Biological & Agricultural Index Plus](#)** Core literature of biology and agriculture—much of it from peer-reviewed journals—plus full text. Full text citations also link to PDF page images, featuring graphs, charts, diagrams, photos, and illustrations indispensable to science research.

**[Book Index With Reviews](#)** Information on more than 3.8 million fiction and non-fiction book titles - across formats, genres and age ranges. Includes more than 800,000 full-text reviews.

**[Book Review Digest Plus](#)** Indexes and excerpts from reviews of current English-language fiction and non-fiction.

**[Business Full Text](#)** Content from The New York Times Business Section and The Wall Street Journal to magazines and scholarly journals. Feature articles, product reviews, interviews, biographical sketches, corporate profiles, obituaries, surveys, book reviews, reports from associations, societies, trade shows and conferences, and more.

**[Business Source Premiere](#)** Scholarly journals and business periodicals covering topics such as management, economics, finance, accounting, and international business.

**[CINAHL Plus Full Text](#)** More than 1,200 English-language nursing journals and publications dating to 1982, from the National League for Nursing and the American Nurses Association.

**[College Source](#)** More than 19,000 college catalogs in complete cover-to-cover, original page format representing 2-year, 4-year, graduate, and professional schools.

**[Computer Database](#)** Access to well-read and influential periodicals on the computer, telecommunications and electronics industries.

**[Criminal Justice Periodicals Index](#)** Full-text and images of articles on corrections administration, law enforcement, social work, industrial security, drug rehabilitation, and criminal and family law.

**[Education Full Text](#)** Topics such as technology, science, art, humanities, business, law, and social sciences. Many articles are in full text.

**[Encyclopædia Britannica](#)** More than 72,000 articles; 10,000 illustrations, photographs, drawings, maps, and flags; 75,000 definitions, including pronunciation guides.

**[Expanded Academic](#)** Articles (many with full-text and images) from scholarly journals, news magazines, and newspapers--arts, humanities, social sciences, science and technology.

**[FirstSearch](#)** More than 50 full- and partial-text databases with topics ranging from the arts and humanities to science and medicine. Multiple databases can be searched at once.

**[Florida Newspapers](#)** Full-text articles from the electronic editions of record for more than 30 Florida newspapers (including Spanish-language editions).

**[Funk & Wagnalls Encyclopedia](#)** More than 25,000 records, covering a wide range of topics. Full text and images are available.

**[General BusinessFile](#)** Information on company performance and activity, industry events and trends, and the latest in management, economics and politics. Users can search broker reports, trade publications, newspapers, journals and company listings.

**[General Reference Center Gold](#)** Articles from national news magazines, encyclopedias, core business journals, Knight-Ridder/Tribune News Service newspaper articles, more than 15 reference books, and more than 2,000 titles, including 1,200 in full text.

**[General Science Full Text](#)** Articles from more than 240 popular science magazines and professional journals. Also covers The New York Times Science Section (weekly).

**[Granger's World Poetry](#)** Tool for finding poems by first line, last line, subject, and author – and which anthology contains a given poem. Includes full-text of nearly 200,000 poems.

**[Health & Wellness Resource Center](#)** Access to full-text nursing and allied health journals, encyclopedias and other reference sources, as well as informational pamphlets. Also includes *Alternative Health* resources.

**[Hoovers Premium](#)** In-depth financial information and insight into industries, companies and their executives.

**[Humanities Full Text](#)** More than 500 English-language periodicals covering literature and language, history, philosophy, archaeology, classical studies, folklore, gender studies, performing arts, history, religion and theology.

**[Informe Revistas en Espanol](#)** Created exclusively for Spanish-speaking users. Provides indexing, images and full text of popular Hispanic magazines -- not just translations. Also included is a thesaurus and interface that are uniquely designed for Spanish-speaking users.

**[InfoTrac OneFile](#)** Includes 4,200 full-text titles and five newspaper indexes from 1980 to present. Approximately 25 million database records are available with a single search query including wire services, newspapers, magazines, refereed academic journals, business publications, technology periodicals, and specialty titles in law, health care and computers.

**[InfoTrac Professional Edition](#)** Selection of 300 full-text journals offering balanced coverage for any professional educator in the arts and humanities, child and adolescent psychology and development, drug and alcohol abuse, health/nutrition/fitness, learning disabilities, literature, school law, science and technology, social sciences or sports training.

**[Issues and Controversies](#)** Current topics research information, including pro/con discussions of hot issues, newspaper editorials, numerical snapshots, photos and graphics, and historical source documents.

**[JSTOR](#)** Back issues of core journals in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences. Most-recent several years (usually 3-5 years) of any particular journal is not available using JSTOR. This resource makes available to the researcher almost one hundred years worth of articles (depending on the start date of each individual journal).

**[Legal Periodicals & Books](#)** International coverage of articles, symposia, jurisdictional surveys, court decisions, legislation, books, and book reviews. Resources for attorneys, educators, business people, librarians, students, and paralegals.

**[LexisNexis Academic](#)** Full-text access to a wide range of news, business, legal, and reference information. Medical & health; federal, state & international legal materials; corporate news & financial information.

**[LitFinder](#)** Full-text poems, stories, plays, explanations, essays, speeches and biographies.

**[Literature Resource Center](#)** Full-text access to biographies, bibliographies, and critical analyses of authors from every age and literary discipline.

**[MagillOnLiterature Plus](#)** Critical analyses and brief plot summaries of most-studied works in literary history; information on notable authors.

**[Military & Government Collection](#)** Designed to offer current news and information to all branches of the military, with a thorough collection of military titles, trade publications and newsweeklies. Includes full text for 350 titles.

**[MLA International Bibliography](#)** (Gale) Access to bibliographic citations to journal articles, books, and dissertations in academic disciplines such as: language, literature, folklore, linguistics, literary theory and criticism, and the dramatic arts.

**[NetLibrary eBooks](#)** Searchable collection of ebooks specifically selected for Florida's community colleges.

**[New York Times](#)** Full-text coverage of The New York Times, from 2000 forward to the present day.

**[New York Times Historical](#)** Full-text and full-image articles for The New York Times, from 1851-2001.

**[Omnifile Full Text Mega](#)** Full text periodicals, with article abstracts and indexing, on business, education, science, social sciences, art, humanities and plus popular magazines.

**[Opposing Viewpoints Resource Center](#)** Viewpoint articles and contextual topic overviews on social issues, statistics, profiles of government agencies and special interest groups court cases, newspaper/magazine articles.

**[Oxford English Dictionary](#)** Online version of the popular print OED – including full text of the OED's 21<sup>st</sup> volume 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition, as well as the 3-volume Additions Series.

**[Readers' Guide Full Text](#)** Current events coverage, curriculum support, and periodicals research for students, educators, and library patrons.

**[Regional Business News](#)** Full-text articles from more than 50 regional business newspapers and periodicals.
