

**Using ACADEMIC SEARCH PREMIER (EBSCO)**

*Covers business, social sciences, humanities, general academic, general science and education.*

***You will need a valid HCC Student ID/Library card number and PIN to access this database.***

1. Go to <http://hccfl.edu/yborlibrary>
2. **Click Online Article Databases**
3. **Click** inside the **Borrower ID** box to activate the cursor. Enter your Student ID/Library Card number (starts with “27777...” or “HCC...”).
4. **Click** inside the **PIN** box to activate the cursor. Enter the last four digits of your Social Security Number. Wait a moment.
5. **Scroll** to and **click** on **General**.
6. **Scroll** to and **click** on **Academic Search Premier (EBSCO)**.
7. **Click Connect to Database**.
8. The search automatically defaults to the **Keyword** search screen. In the **Find** box, type your keywords. Use **AND** to combine more than one term, for example:  

**Internet voting AND security      capital punishment AND United States AND judicial selection**
9. If you want only full-text articles in your results, **click** the **Full Text** box.
10. **Click** the **Search** button. A results list of articles will appear. You may select to view results separately for Academic Journals, Magazines, Newspapers or Books/Monographs.
11. **Click** the article title to read the article.
12. **Scroll** down to read past the citation and abstract to get to the full article. You will need to click the **PDF Full Text** or the **HTML Full Text** links to view the text of some of the articles.

**To Print:** On the article of your choice, **click Print** at the top of the screen. The **Print Manager** box will appear. If the defaults are to your liking, **click Print** again. EBSCO will convert the text of the article to a clean, “printer-friendly” version.\*\*

To select another article, **click BACK** at the bottom of the **Print Manager** box to return to the article, then click **Result List** at the top of the article screen to return to your search results. If printing from the library, your article will print out from one of the printers at the end of the table. **Please print only what you need.**
