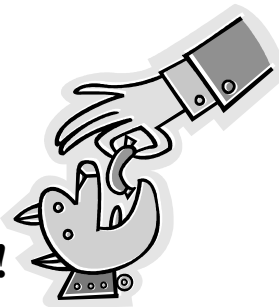


Google

TEACHING GOOGLE NEW TRICKS!



Everybody knows how to use Google, but here are some tricks to make it search better.

Go to <http://google.com> and try these advanced search techniques

Search example	Will find pages containing.....
<u>vacation Hawaii</u>	the words <i>vacation</i> and <i>Hawaii</i>
<u>Maui OR Hawaii</u>	either the word <i>Maui</i> or the word <i>Hawaii</i>
<u>“to each his own”</u>	the exact phrase <i>to each his own</i>
<u>virus –computer</u>	the word <i>virus</i> but NOT the word <i>computer</i>
<u>Star Wars Episode +I</u>	the movie title, including the roman numeral I
<u>~auto loan</u>	loan info for both the word <i>auto</i> and its synonyms: <i>truck, car, etc.</i>
<u>define:computer</u>	definitions of the word <i>computer</i> from around the Web
<u>red * blue</u>	the words <i>red</i> and <i>blue</i> separated by one or more words

DOMAIN RESTRICT

Domains are the last part of an Internet address; www.hccfl.edu - **.edu** in this case, tells you that the Internet site is from an educational institution. Other addresses might end in **.com** – for commercial sites, **.org** – for organization sites (frequently non-profit), or **.gov** – for government sites.

If you are doing serious research for a college paper or speech, **.edu** sites are in many cases the best. You can make Google search only educational sites by typing your search term(s) and adding **site:edu**
EXAMPLE: **drug abuse site:edu** will return pages on drug abuse, but only from educational sites.



NEW FROM GOOGLE

Search **Google Scholar** to find very scholarly articles from around the world. This is an excellent source for research papers. <http://scholar.google.com>

Search **Google Print** for Google’s new project of digitizing many books from large university and college libraries. <http://print.google.co>
